I've followed those steps whenever my "Muffin" burrows under her fence to freedom. But when those measures fail, the question becomes: What can I do next?

Only recently I discovered what a powerful help the Internet can be in reuniting lost pets with their owners. Fortunately, I learned this lesson not from losing Muffin again, but rather from finding a stray dog. I was doing yard work one morning when I noticed a brown Labrador tiptoeing behind me. The

What an inspiration! I snapped a photo of the Labrador forthwith, and posted it on the "Lost Pets Kirksville, Missouri" website. Within a few hours the news spread to

"Fido's" owner, and the dog was back home in time for supper. In another instance, I was connected to a wandering terrier's owner within 30 minutes after I posted her photo on Facebook.

My experience has taught me what a fabulous help Facebook can be in returning lost pets to their owners. I hope your Fido never goes missing, but when he does, please remember you have a friend in Facebook.

(Maybe it reminds him of his first 6 weeks of life in a puppy pile.) He won't wake up until I close this laptop (one of his favorite sounds!) and we go out for our afternoon walk. He is our boy, a 13 year old mutt named Skip, and we would do pretty much anything for him.

Lots of people feel this way about their dogs and cats. This includes people with the necessary funds to pay for vet services, and those who lack those means. And if you love an animal, it breaks your heart to see her hurting, pregnant again, struggling to nurse her babies, not to mention the heartbreak of sending those babies away to an uncertain future. 

Since we started our work in 2013 we have helped nearly one thousand pets lead healthier, safer lives and contributed to the well-being of their owners by lowering their cost of pet ownership and preventing unwanted litters. In 2016 alone KV-POP helped people in our area spay or neuter 206 pets.

Please help us continue our work with your financial contribution. Our costs for spay/neuter services are \$60-\$95 for dogs and \$40-\$60 for cats. On average we spend about \$620 per month. As the number of applications increases, our funds can be quickly depleted.

In addition to supporting Kirksville's Trap-Neuter-Return program within the city limits, we are receiving more and more requests for help in neutering rural cat colonies and while we want to help, we can only do so much.
